Important Information

How to Complete

Applicants are required to complete an acquittal (either a Standard Funding Report Form or a Progress Report) upon receiving ClubGRANTS funding from a club. The purpose of the acquittal is to ascertain the manner in which that funding was applied.

If an acquittal is not received from a benefiting organisation, no additional Category 1 funding will be considered, other than in exceptional circumstances.

Grants Up to And Including \$7,500

Organisations receiving ClubGRANTS funds of up to and including \$7,500 must provide a report detailing the application of the ClubGRANTS funds. Where a previously funded project has not been completed within the current tax year, a progress report must be provided.

- For cash amounts of less than \$500, a receipt will suffice. For in-kind funding valued at less than \$500 (such as free use of club meeting rooms), a letter of acknowledgement from the benefiting organisation or individual is required.
- In the case of cash or in-kind expenditure for funding of between \$500 and \$7,500, a written report from the recipient as to the application of the funding is required.

Grants over \$7,500

Organisation who receive ClubGRANTS funding exceeding \$7,500 must complete a written report as to the application of the funding and this must be accompanied by a statutory declaration.

Where a project has not been completed within a tax year, a progress report must be provided accompanied by a statutory declaration.

More Information

The ClubGRANTS Application Guide has been prepared to assist applicants navigate the Scheme. The Guide provides general information on the various funding categories, who can apply, how to apply, and reporting requirements. It also provides advice to applicants on how to stand out from the pack and how to say thanks.

Please describe the outcomes of the program, project or service funded:

This program has rovedn very popular, and it regularly fills up fast with waiting lists on standby. Families in the area who are impacted by autism have been coming together at the venue each fortnight. The program was initially intended as a monthly activity, however, the venue (Zone Bowling) graciously extended a cheaper rate when we started and this allowed us to provide it twice a month. This meant that more families had the opportunity for more regular social connecting and it became evenmore popular. As an added treat, we introduced laser tag at the venue on the first session of the month after bowling and a birthday celebration on the second session of the month. This has meant that all autistic children with a birthday that month could celebrate with other kids and families together, via the purchase by us of a cake and candles each time. Typicaly families struggle to find school friends to attend their autistic children's parties, and this has meant a lot to families.

How did this support make a difference to your organisation?

The program and its regular activities have meant that families in the Hornsby LGA and its surriiunds have come to trust that the ACN understands their needs and is the place where they can escape the isolation they and their children too ofen experience. We have seen friendships formed and others step up to become involved as volunteers and community leaders.

What are your future plans related to this project or the partnerships formed while implementing the project?

We plan to continue this program as a mainstay activity for families in the area. The funding we have recived has made this easier for people to access without the considerations of financial restraints and we have seen the numbers grow. When we first tried this activity the previous year without funding it was as user pays, and we saw that people were willingto pay to get involved in a social opportunity for their children. This showed us that the activity is popular. As described above, the funding has enabled us to do more, and to also draw others who would not have been able to afford the games.
